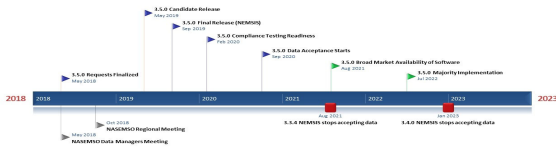

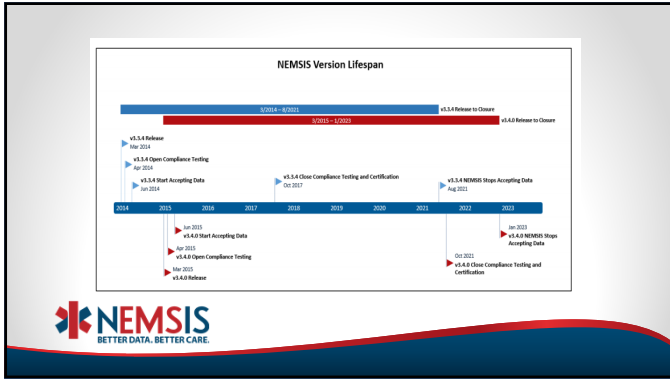
NEMESIS Versioning Schedule

During the NEMSIS 3.5 implementation meeting and continued through a monthly 18 implementation webinars and NEMSIS 3.5 Data Managers Committee calls. An initial release of 3.5.0 was made available in September 2019, with a critical path following in November 2019.
